Hand sanitizer will be provided for your use as you enter the Institute. The normal guidelines in place due to the coronavirus pandemic will apply - i.e. face masks to be worn, social distancing, etc. Anyone not complying may not be allowed into the Institute.

## Traffic Lights at Dyffryn Hill

You may have noticed there are temporary traffic lights at the top of Dyffryn Hill, on the way to Tywyn just beyond the cemetery. We have been told that there is subsidence between the road and the railway line, which has been caused by a badger set in the side of the hill. Badgers are a protected species and work cannot begin on rectifying the problem until the end of the current breeding season, though it is hoped that the work will be done as soon as possible and be finished before the main summer season.

The area at the entrance to Dyfi Yard Repairs known as the boat storage area, is an area of common land that is used specifically for the fishermen to store their pots and equipment and it is essential for their businesses to have such an area. The area between the golf club car park and the boat storage area used to be a running track and is now a protected area for otters.
