

Burma Road hedge

Did you know a wildlife hedge has been planted along the Burma road? It is still very young but doing well. It may look a little unkempt but wildlife does not like tidy verges, gardens, or hedges. Every green plant is a home to some form of wildlife. There are nettles growing in among the new hedge plants but they are not doing them any harm and are in fact great **wildlife** attractors: caterpillars of the small tortoiseshell and peacock butterflies use them as food plants; ladybirds feast on the aphids that shelter among them; and seed-eating birds enjoy their autumn spoils. In time the hedge will thicken and shade out the nettles and a new generation of wildlife species will take over.

So remember when your garden looks a little untidy, don't forget to leave a few areas for the insects and birds.

Griffiths has been appointed as the Main Contractor by the Welsh Government to construct the A487 New Dyfi Bridge.

We feel extremely privileged to have been awarded this contract and are very much looking forward to beginning our works, as well as meeting the residents and the wider community of Machynlleth.

Works will begin onsite in May 2021 and are anticipated to be completed by Summer 2023. Over the next couple of months, we will be mobilising our work force, setting up our site compound and undertaking site clearance works. Construction of the new bridge will commence in August 2021.
