Once the results have been compiled, we will hold events to discuss the results to decide what the needs of the community are and what we as a community can do about it.


The survey can be accessed online or it can be done over the phone if you prefer. The closing date is soon, so please fill it in NOW!

Aberdyfi Art Society Exhibition




Rubbish problems
