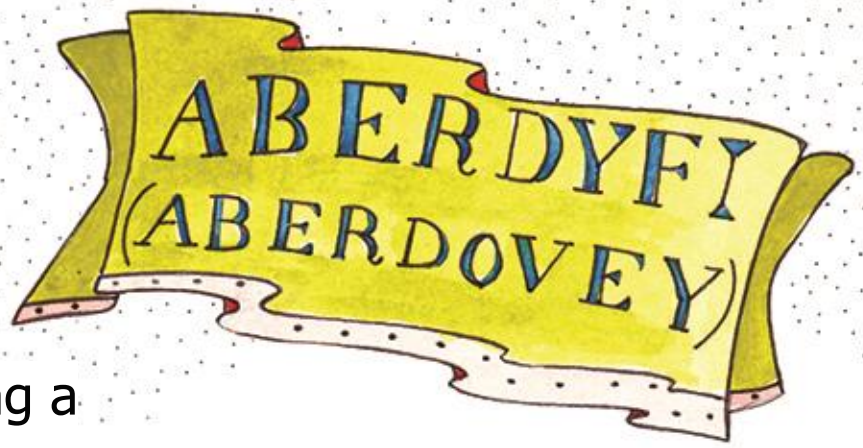

Ever thought of being a firefighter? 🧑‍🚒🧑‍🚒

We have available positions for 8 new crew members on both Aberdyfi and Tywyn fire stations.. That's 16 empty pegs waiting to be filled!!!

The roll is a paid position and you will be employed, entitled to a pension scheme, holiday pay, and other benefits. All training is paid for, including travel, once trained you will be available to respond to emergency incidents and alerted by a pager.

We train once a week for 3 hours on a Thursday 1830-2130 where we practice drills, scenarios, updates on equipment, policies and vital information. We are supplied with the most up to date equipment and trained to the highest standards.

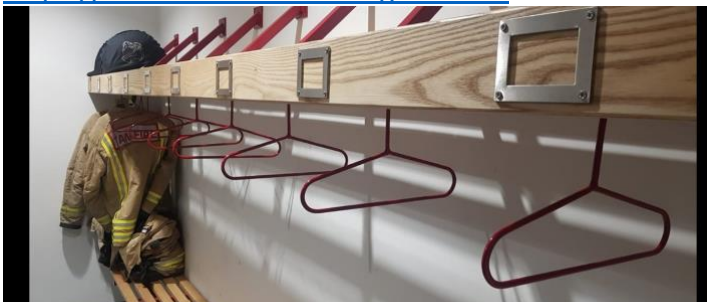
On average we respond to incidents once a week.

If you think this would suit you and you want to help protect your community, be part of a professional team, and want to gain further training with more courses and skills come and see us on station or facebook North Wales Fire and Rescue Service.

We will be holding an open day in Thursday 25th November 10am to 7pm where you can chat to crews, take a look around, see the equipment, stations and hear what is required for the next steps.

You have to be at least 18 years old to join.
